


POPULATION

Pend Oreille County is located in the northeast corner of Washington State bordering Canada to the north. In 2018, Pend Oreille County was the thirty-third most populous county in the state with 13,540 individuals. This accounted for less than 1% of the state's population. Most of the population lives in Unincorporated Pend Oreille, with only 16% living in the county's largest city Newport. Of the 39 counties in Washington State, Pend Oreille County had the seventh lowest population density with a density of 9.67 individuals per square mile. The Washington State density for all counties was 111.77 individuals per square mile.

In 2017, adults 18 to 34 made up the smallest proportion of Pend Oreille County's population. Pend Oreille County had smaller proportions of adults ages 18-34 and higher proportions of seniors ages 65 years or older than Washington State. Over the last decade, the proportion of the population younger than 18 years of age decreased approximately 4%. The proportion of the population aged 65 years or older increased approximately 8%.

According to 2017 data, Pend Oreille County was not racially diverse. Among county residents, 91.4% were white, 3.9% were American Indian/ Alaska Native, 3.4% were of two or more races, while all other groups made up less than 1% of the population. Hispanics comprised 3.4% of the population, far lower than the statewide population with 12.8% identifying as Hispanic. Hispanics are included in all race categories.



Distribution of Population by Age and Sex, Pend Oreille County, 2017







Among students who began ninth grade, 90.6% graduated from high school on time during the 2016/2017 school year. Another 2% continued high school beyond the traditional graduation date and completed high school in an extended period. Statewide, 79.3% of students graduated on time. Since the 2014/2015 school year, Pend Oreille County has consistently performed better than Washington State.

On-Time High School Graduation





HEALTH INSURANCE AND DISABILITY

For the 2012-2016 U.S. Census Bureau's American Community Survey estimate period, approximately 10.8% of Pend Oreille County's population was uninsured. The uninsured rate significantly decreased since 2009-2013, from 14.6% to 10.8%, likely reflecting the enactment of the Affordable Care Act. Those who were 18 to 34 years of age, male, and Asian alone had the highest proportion of being uninsured in their respective demographic categories. The uninsured rate in Pend Oreille County was higher than Washington State.

In Pend Oreille County for the 2012-2016 ACS estimate period, 21.7% of the population had a disability. Disability includes those with hearing, vision, cognitive, ambulatory, self-care, or independent living difficulties. Among those with a disability, 66.1% were 75 years of age or older. Overall, Pend Oreille County had higher disability rates than the state.

INCOME AND POVERTY

Estimates of median household income were based on the U.S. Census Bureau's American Community Survey (ACS) estimates for 2006-2015 and census data from 2000. These model-based estimates may differ from other median household income data developed from the Washington State Office of Financial Management's State Population Survey, Bureau of the Census estimates, or other sources.

The projected median household income in Pend Oreille County for 2017 was \$49,720, compared to \$68,550 statewide. The median household income has been increasing since 2014. For 2012 to 2016, approximately 26.2% of individuals in the county lived below 125% federal poverty level (FPL), and 42.1% lived below 200% FPL. The proportion of Pend Oreille County residents living in poverty (below 200% FPL) was significantly higher than the statewide proportion (29%).





EMPLOYMENT

Of the estimated 4,262 individuals 16 years of age or older in Pend Oreille County in 2017, there were 4,734 individuals (42.5%) working or actively seeking work. The average unemployment rate in Pend Oreille County in 2017 was 7.5%, compared to 4.8% in Washington State.²

HOUSING

For the 2012 to 2016 ACS estimate period, there were an estimated 8,018 housing units in Pend Oreille County. Of those, 32.5% were vacant. The majority of occupied housing were owner-occupied (76.9%) while the remaining housing units (23.1%) were renter-occupied. The homeowner vacancy rate was 3.5%, while the rental vacancy rate was 7.7% during this period.

The proportion of occupied housing lacking complete plumbing facilities and complete kitchen facilities was slightly higher in Pend Oreille County compared to Washington State. In Pend Oreille County, 1.5% of occupied housing lacked complete plumbing facilities and 1.1% lacked complete kitchen facilities. This is compared to only 0.4% of occupied housing in Washington State lacking complete plumbing facilities and 1% of occupied housing lacking complete kitchen facilities.³

In 2017, the median price of homes in Pend Oreille County was \$169,200 compared to \$348,900 in Washington State. Estimates of median home prices vary greatly in smaller areas. The median price of home sales in Pend

Oreille County varied between \$119,800 to \$169,200 between 2012 and 2017. Housing affordability slightly decreased in both Pend Oreille County and Washington State. Housing affordability was estimated based on the National Association of Realtors' Housing Affordability Index, defined as the ability of a middle-income family to carry the mortgage payments on a median price home. Housing was consistently more affordable in Pend Oreille County than Washington State.⁴





Age of Housing Stock, 2012-2016




