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## **POPULATION**

Ferry County is located in the northeast corner of Washington State bordering Canada to the north. In 2019, Ferry County was the thirty-sixth most populous county in the state with 7,830 individuals. This accounted for less than 1% of the state's population. Most of the population lives in unincorporated Ferry, with only 14% living in the county's only incorporated city Republic. Of the 39 counties in Washington State, Ferry County had the second lowest population density with a density of 3.55 individuals per square mile. The Washington State density for all counties was 113.56 individuals per square mile.

In 2019, adults ages 19-34 made up the smallest proportion of Ferry County's population. Ferry County had smaller proportions of children ages 0-19 and higher proportions of seniors ages 65 years or older than Washington State.

According to 2019 data, Ferry County was comprised of two primary racial groups. Among county residents, 76.4% were white, 15.4% were American Indian/ Alaska Native, 6.1% were of two or more races, 1.4% were Asian, while all other groups made up less than 1% of the population. Hispanics comprised 4.2% of the population, far lower than the statewide population with 13.2% identifying as Hispanic. Hispanics are included in all race categories.



### Distribution of Population by Age and Sex, Ferry County, 2019







#### **High School Completion in Ferry County**

Among students who began ninth grade, 47.6% graduated from high school on time during the 2019/2020 school year. Another 23.3% continued high school beyond the traditional graduation date. Statewide, 82.9% of students graduated on time. From the 2014/2015 school year to the 2016/2017 school year, Ferry County and Washington State had similar high school graduation rates, until Ferry county experienced a significant decrease in graduation rate for the 2017/2018 school year to 28.4%.

### **On-Time High School Graduation**





# HEALTH INSURANCE AND DISABILITY

For the 2015-2019 American Community Survey (ACS) estimate period, approximately 7.2% of Ferry County's population was uninsured. The uninsured rate significantly decreased since 2011-2015, from 14.1% to 7.2%. Those who were 19 to 64 years of age, male, American Indian and Alaska Native alone, and Native Hawaiian and Other Pacific Islander had the highest proportion of being uninsured in their respective demographic categories. The uninsured rate in Ferry County was higher than Washington State.

In Ferry County for the 2015-2019 ACS estimate period, 26.3% of the population had a disability. Disability includes those with hearing, vision, cognitive, ambulatory, self-care, or independent living difficulties. Among those with a disability, 60.4% were 75 years of age or older. Overall, Ferry County had higher disability rates than the state.

### **INCOME AND POVERTY**

Estimates of median household income were based on the U.S. Census Bureau's American Community Survey (ACS) estimates for 2005-2019 and census data from 2010. These model-based estimates may differ from other median household income data developed from the Washington State Office of Financial Management's State Population Survey, Bureau of the Census estimates, or other sources.

The projected median household income in Ferry County for 2019 was \$49,928, compared to \$74,992 statewide. The projected 2019 median household income increased from the previous year. For 2015 to 2019, approximately 24.3% of individuals in the county lived below 125% federal poverty level (FPL), and 41.6% lived below 200% FPL. The proportion of Ferry County residents living in poverty (below 200% FPL) was significantly higher than the statewide proportion (25.6%).



# **EMPLOYMENT**

Of the estimated 2,499 individuals in the civilian labor force in Ferry County in 2019, there were 2,216 individuals employed. The average unemployment rate in Ferry in 2019 was 11.3%, compared to 4.3% in Washington State.<sup>2</sup>

# HOUSING

For the 2015 to 2019 ACS estimate period, there were an estimated 4,526 housing units in Ferry County. Of those, 32.4% were vacant. The majority of occupied housing were owner-occupied (72%) while the remaining housing units (28%) were renter-occupied. The homeowner vacancy rate was 2.4%, while the rental vacancy rate was 5.9% during this period.

The proportion of occupied housing lacking complete plumbing facilities and complete kitchen facilities was higher in Ferry County compared to Washington State. In Ferry County, 3.6% of occupied housing lacked complete plumbing facilities and 3.1% lacked complete kitchen facilities. This is compared to only 0.4% of occupied housing in Washington State lacking complete plumbing facilities and 1% of occupied housing lacking complete kitchen facilities.<sup>3</sup>

In 2020 Quarter 4, the median price of homes in Ferry County was \$187,000 compared to \$460,300 in Washington State. Estimates of median home prices vary greatly in smaller areas. The median price of home sales in Ferry County varied between \$152,700 to \$187,000 between 2018 and 2020.

In 2020, housing affordability slightly decreased in Ferry County and slightly increased in Washington State. Housing affordability was estimated based on the National Association of Realtors' Housing Affordability Index, defined as the ability of a middle-income family to carry the mortgage payments on a median price home. Housing was consistently more affordable in Ferry County than Washington State.<sup>4</sup>





### Age of Housing Stock, 2015-2019




### **Housing Affordability Index**
