

POPULATION

Asotin County is located in the southeast corner of Washington State bordering Idaho to the east. In 2021, Asotin County was the twenty-first most populous county in the state with 22,500 individuals. This accounted for less than 1% of the state's population. Most of the population lives in unincorporated Asotin, with 32.1% living in the county's largest incorporated city Clarkston. Of the 39 counties in Washington State, Asotin County had the twenty-first lowest population density with a density of 35.37 individuals per square mile. The Washington State density for all counties was 116.88 individuals per square mile.

In 2021, adults ages 20-34 made up the smallest proportion of Asotin County's population. Asotin County had smaller proportions of children ages 0-19 and higher proportions of seniors ages 65 years or older than Washington State.

According to 2021 data, Asotin County was not racially diverse. Among county residents, 87.4% were white, 1.2% were American Indian/ Alaska Native, 5.3% were of two or more races, while all other groups made up less than 1% of the population. Hispanics comprised 4.5% of the population, far lower than the statewide population with 14.2% identifying as Hispanic. Hispanics are included in all race categories.





Among students who began ninth grade, 80.5% graduated from high school on time during the 2020/2021 school year. Another 9.1% continued high school beyond the traditional graduation date. Statewide, 82.5% of students graduated on time. From the 2014/2015 school year to the 2019/2020 school year, Asotin County had lower graduation rates than Washington State, with a slight increase from 2018/2019 to 2020/2021 school year.





HEALTH INSURANCE AND DISABILITY

For the 2016-2020 American Community Survey (ACS) estimate period, approximately 6.2% of Asotin County's population was uninsured. Those who were 19 to 64 years of age, male, and Black or African American alone had the highest proportion of being uninsured in their respective demographic categories. The uninsured rate in Asotin County was the same as Washington State.

In Asotin County for the 2016-2020 ACS estimate period, 18.4% of the population had a disability. Disability includes those with hearing, vision, cognitive, ambulatory, selfcare, or independent living difficulties. Among those with a disability, 53.7% were 75 years of age or older. Overall, Asotin County had higher disability rates than the state.

INCOME AND POVERTY

Estimates of median household income were based on the U.S. Census Bureau's American Community Survey (ACS) estimates for 2016-2020 and the Washington State Office of Financial Management from 2021.

The projected median household income in Asotin County for 2021 was \$52,014, compared to \$81,998 statewide. The projected 2021 median household income decreased from the previous year. For 2016 to 2020, approximately 18.5% of individuals in the county lived below 125% federal poverty level (FPL), and 37.6% lived below 200% FPL. The proportion of Asotin County residents living in poverty below 200% FPL was significantly higher than the statewide proportion (24.1%).



EMPLOYMENT

Of the estimated 10,623 individuals in the civilian labor force in Asotin County in 2021, there were 10,228 individuals employed. The average unemployment rate in Asotin in 2021 was 3.7%, compared to 5.2% in Washington State.²

HOUSING

For the 2016 to 2020 American Community Survey (ACS) estimate period, there were an estimated 10,078 housing units in Asotin County. Of those, 7.9% were vacant. The majority of occupied housing were owner-occupied (72.2%) while the remaining housing units (27.8%) were renter-occupied. The homeowner vacancy rate was 2.4%, while the rental vacancy rate was 1.3% during this period.

The proportion of occupied housing lacking complete plumbing facilities and complete kitchen facilities was lower in Asotin County compared to Washington State. In Asotin County, 0.1% of occupied housing lacked complete plumbing facilities and 0.3% lacked complete kitchen facilities. This is compared to 0.4% of occupied housing in Washington State lacking complete plumbing facilities and 1.1% of occupied housing lacking complete kitchen facilities.³

In 2022 Quarter 1, the median price of homes in Asotin County was \$258,300 compared to \$563,600 in Washington State. Estimates of median home prices vary greatly in smaller areas. The median price of home sales in Asotin County varied between \$198,500 to \$258,300 between 2020

and 2022. In 2022, housing affordability slightly decreased in Quarter 1 in Asotin County and slightly decreased in Washington State. Housing affordability was estimated based on the National Association of Realtors' Housing Affordability Index, defined as the ability of a middle-income family to carry the mortgage payments on a median price home. Housing was consistently more affordable in Asotin County than Washington State.⁴






Age of Housing Stock
